## In Honor of their Service

This past week many residents and members of the law enforcement community attended the memorial services of California Highway Patrol Officer Brian Law and Officer Juan Gonzalez who were killed in a single vehicle crash while responding to an accident call on Highway 99, near Bethel Avenue, in Kingsburg. In 2014, Officer Law and Gonzalez, along with 13 other Officers in the State of California, gave their lives serving and protecting residents in our state. As City Manager, I have worked with hundreds of Police Officers who have devoted their lives quietly serving their communities, coaching the son's Little League Team and attending PTA meetings. Law enforcement is the most important function of local government. We invest so much trust and respect for all those who wear a badge and make the sacrifice. My son Travis is currently studying criminal justice and I look forward to someday pinning a Police Officer Badge on his chest someday.

In Greenfield, we are all excited about welcoming our new Police Chief Adele Fresé to Greenfield. She will be sworn into service at 2:00 PM on March 17<sup>th</sup> at City Hall and I invite everyone to come to City Hall and give her a warm welcome. Prior to her assuming leadership of our Police Department, we will also have a Celebration of Service for the outstanding leadership provided by outgoing Interim Police Chief Dan Ortega at 2pm on Friday March 14<sup>th</sup>. After many years of polarized debate, Greenfield is excited about its Police Department and the leadership that Chief Fresé will provide to our men and women who, every day and every night, serve and protect all of us with honor and distinction.

As reported in the media last week, Greenfield Police Department responded to another homicide which resulted in the arrest of one person charged with murder. When blood drains our own sidewalks in Greenfield, there is a natural tendency to personalize the violence as a problem that is only happening to us. It's truly unfortunate that every community in Salinas Valley has to devote extensive resources to combat gang violence. However, as the arrest made this week shows, our Greenfield Police are properly responding to these acts of violence, making arrests and doing what they can to keep our streets safe.

We have much to be thankful for in Greenfield, for our honorable Police Department dedicated to protecting and serving. In my last City, our Police Chaplin would often recite this special prayer before we began our City Council which I think might be in order this week in light of other events:

***Almighty God, Whose great power and eternal wisdom embraces the universe, watch over all policemen and law enforcement officers everywhere. Protect them from harm in the performance of their duty to stop crime, robbery, riots, and violence. We pray, help them keep our streets and homes safe, day and night. We commend them to Your loving care, because their duty is dangerous; grant them strength and courage in their daily assignments. Dear God, protect these brave men and women. Grant them Your almighty protection, and unite them safely with their families after their duty has ended. Amen.***

On Sunday, February 23, 2014, at approximately 8:16p.m. Greenfield Police Officer Corey Smith was behind 102 El Camino Real and heard gunshots coming from the front of that address. Ofc. Smith drove in the direction of the front of the business and observed a suspect running and carrying a handgun. Ofc. Smith pursued the suspect on foot, east on Maple and observed the suspect drop the gun. The suspect then stopped running and surrendered to the officer. Other officers responding to the scene found a male adult victim laying on the ground between 102 and 104 El Camino Real with multiple gunshot wounds. Emergency medical response was requested and the victim was pronounced dead at the scene. Greenfield Police Department received assistance at the scene from officers from California Highway Patrol, Monterey County Sheriff's Office, King City Police Department and California Department of Corrections.

Person Arrested: Arnulfo Pineda DOB: 02-01-79 was charged with murder plus firearm charges and gang enhancements.

# GREENFIELD POLICE DEPARTMENT CRIMES CAMPARISON 2012-2013

After experiencing six homicides in 2012, the City of Greenfield had one homicide in 2013 which was gang related. Four of the homicides in 2012 were gang related. Robberies for both years remained about the same but aggravated assaults were down by more than 25% in 2013. Domestic violence aggravated assaults were down by 39%. Burglary was down by 40% but, unfortunately, there was a significant increase in auto theft (43%) increase. The Greenfield Police Department is working very hard to make 2014 an even safer year for the community.




